The Thrombosis Research Institute (TRI) is a world leader in the field of real-world outcomes research, developing and executing global programmes. Our success comes through partnership with a network of more than 2,500 research centres in around 40 countries.

One of our most important studies is the Global Anticoagulant Registry in the FIELD–Atrial Fibrillation (GARFIELD-AF) which is a pioneering, independent outcomes research initiative led by an international steering committee under the auspices of the TRI. GARFIELD-AF is the largest prospective study of patients with atrial fibrillation (AF) and has now generated at least 2 years of follow-up data in over 52,000 patients with newly diagnosed AF.

A wealth of new data from GARFIELD-AF are being presented during this year's ESC Congress including two presentations at the late breaking science session "Arrhythmias" on Saturday 31st August and on Monday 2nd September, one "Moderated ePoster" presentation and one Poster presentation. Key results will also be unveiled during the TRI Satellite Symposium on Saturday 31st August 2019 which will also showcase the new GARFIELD-AF risk score and its online application.

TRI's presentations on GARFIELD-AF at ESC Congress 2019 are summarised overleaf. We also invite you to visit our stand, K800 in Exhibition 2, to find out about our pioneering research programmes. TRI representatives will be on hand on the stand every day of the congress to answer your questions.
